

1. 1<sup>st</sup> Peter is the only book in the Bible where it is all about you. It is usually all about God and his glory.
2. Chapter 5:1-11 tells us that the glory we share in is still for God's glory.
3. Ch. 1:20 tells us that Jesus was made to be seen for you and I; seen as a humble, suffering, servant who is then exalted and glorified.
4. Ch. 4:12 reminds us that even our fiery trials (1:7) are especially for you and I; custom designed for us.
5. Ch. 1:2 tells us that it is about you and I because of God's grace. It is who he is. This verse is a prayer of blessing, not a desire that grace just might be to us.
6. Ch. 1:10 tells us that grace has specific moments of coming to us.
7. Ch. 1:13 shows us that the grace comes to us when Jesus appears (in your trial).
8. Ch. 1:12 tells us that grace comes to us through people.
9. Ch. 1:25 reminds us that though it is through people, it only comes when the result is the gospel of Jesus Christ coming to us.
10. God using fiery trials to bring grace to us is such a strange thing that Christianity has rejected this truth and changed the presentation of the true gospel by pretending some of its preachers are not so flawed and that flaws and trials are actually proof that God is displeased with us.
11. Pastors and leaders are to be ensamples to the flock. An ensample is a pattern to be followed and imitated. (learn how to suffer trials for God's glory) Ch. 5:1-3
12. Ch. 5:5 is the submission, humility factor of grace. We need to learn submission and humility in order for grace to show up; for Jesus to be seen.
13. The exaltation factor of grace. Ch. 5:6 Exaltation follows humility.
14. The completion factor of grace is that God will make us perfect, stablish us, strengthen us, and settle us. Ch. 5:10
